| <p>York Bursary A means-tested bursary</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> UK or EU resident students with residual household incomes of £35,000 or less. York Bursaries are not available to students on whole-year placements in industry or study abroad programmes, or on an NHS funded nursing course. Social Work students are only eligible for the York Bursary in years when they do not receive the NHS Social Work Bursary. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Where household income is £25,000 or less: £2,400 in the first year of the course, and £1,800 in subsequent years. Where household income is between £25,001 and £35,000: £1,000 per year. |
| <p>Foundation Year Bursary (Extended Degree Students)</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> UK/ EU students studying for the foundation year of an Extended Degree programme (Year 0), either at York College or the University of York. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students with a household income of £25,000 or less will be entitled to a fee waiver of £5,600. If eligible (see above), these students can be considered for a York Bursary of £2,400 in Year 1 and £1,800 in Year 2 onwards. Students with a household income of £25,001 or higher will be entitled to a fee waiver of £3,000. If eligible (see above) these students can be considered for a York Bursary of £1,000 per year for subsequent years. |
| <p>Care Leavers and Foyer Bursary</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students aged 25 or under who have been in the care of their UK local authority or who have come through the national Foyer Federation. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The total value of the award is £4,000 in the first year and £2,500 in subsequent years. The package is available for each year of full-time study for the duration of the course, reduced by 50% for full-year sandwich placements or study abroad years. |

| Hull York Medical School (HYMS) Bursary | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> For students on the HYMS MBBS programme, with a residual household income of up to £25,000. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A bursary of £2,400 for each year of study. |
| York Opportunity Awards | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> These Awards support talented students who have overcome significant barriers to their educational goals. Open to students holding an offer for undergraduate study starting in September 2016. Permanent residents in the UK, classified as Home (UK) in university admissions procedures. Able to demonstrate that you have overcome significant barriers in your personal, social or domestic life to achieving your educational goals. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Total of £3,300, paid in annual instalments of £1,100 for three years. |

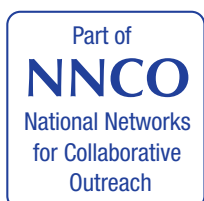

| <p>York St John Bursary</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UK & EU students. • For students with a residual household income of below £25,000. • Full and part-time PGCE, School Direct, NHS, and those Foundation Degree students paying the £3,500 fees are not eligible for this bursary. • You will automatically be notified by York St John if you are eligible. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • £500 per year. |
| <p>Care Leaver support</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who have been in care in the three years before starting their course. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • £1,000 per year |
| <p>Undergraduate Scholarship To celebrate the University's 175th anniversary, 175 scholarships are available for September 2016 entrants.</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For 'Home' (UK and EU) full-time undergraduate students, starting a full-time undergraduate course in September 2016. • All undergraduate courses are included except Biomedical Science, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Teacher Training. • You need to accept York St John as your firm choice through UCAS. • The top 175 highest-achieving entrants will be awarded a scholarship. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Total of £1,750, to be paid in two instalments in February and May in your first year of study. |
